The schedule for the day at PYC: **8:30 a.m. Saturday April 27**, Sandy Sanstrom and Steve Haines will offer an RC safety boat workshop: Hands-on for race committee members who will be in boats and have a CT

boating license. Will learn competency on the water: docking, rescue techniques, boat handling etc.

1:00- 3 p.m. Saturday April 27, FOUR TOPICS will be discussed with RC members.
